 - In support of a community member Ms Sally who has been using this bus stop @ 49th Street for 25 years. In Eastside traffic, those with mobility issues are not able to navigate the sidewalk.
 - This letter has been developed by a couple people from Verde working with our community members.
 - Chris: Is this bus stop on both sides of the street? Yes. Will there be a built out bus stop? No it wouldn't.
 - Gregory: Are there alternatives? Ms Sally can take the Trimet on-call lift, they do come out and pick you up, and she does this sometimes.
 - Chris: Are there any negatives to this? Does it take away parking spots?

 - David: Executive committee of the Exploration Leadership Committee along with the ELC (?) is very close to completing the TIF plan

- Michael: There was some discussion at the General Meeting. I did attend the last TIF meeting. There was a suggestion there would be another meeting. Next meeting is May 11 at 5:30pm, hosted by Press for Portland.

- Transportation & Land Use (David)
 - Status of the Residential Infill Project part 2 (RIP2)
 - NOTES
 - Tomorrow- City Council will be holding a hearing on RIP2. This is necessary to give the cities the process to conform with state law by July 1 or they have to adopt the State's model code.
 - Most of this is good news for Cully. Allows the benefits of RIP to be extended to R10 + R20 zones, we do have this in Cully north of Killingsworth. (low density residential w minimum of 10k Sq ft)
 - Also good news is that in accordance with state law, when duplex/multiplexes/fourplex are built under RIP, there will be an expedited process to drop in a property line, so each unit can be sold more easily vs. having to create a condominium to sell the units.
 - This will create lower priced townhomes available to more people for purchase. This will allow for "attached duplexes" - people can now have 2 separate homes. If an ADU, it was limited in size based on it being 2/3 size of the existing house. Now people can build a second full size house (compared to ADU).
 - People can benefit from this. Can get bank financing for a house, whereas you couldn't typically do this with an ADU.
 - The next TLC(?) meeting will be June 7 will feature a presentation from Pacific Power and hoping for an update from Ethos Development their plans for 42nd and Prescott and the other project near Sacajawea Park which is slated to start next summer.
- Cully Air Action Team (Gregory)
 - PSU Project
 - Discussion:
 - Gregory: This needs to be decided by tonight. Project by PSU - they are seeking a grant with NSF - looking at how climate change issues are being described in marginalized communities using digital resources.
 - I worked with this professor previously and he has drawn in a good circle of professionals, agency people, to talk about this topic - how marginalized communities are being delivered information regarding

environmentally in digital format. It was a 4 day symposium and it was excellent.

- Now this is a new project - he wants to design a project to draw together community members to discuss how information is being transmitted using digital means to communicate to marginalized communities. There is a stipend that will go out to those involved. Maybe 1-3 hour or two meetings to gather information re: how they get information about climate change.
- Gregory was asked to sign on as a CAN associate; whereas previously, Gregory has represented CAAT. CAAT is a part of CAN and up to this point, Gregory has tried to keep a separation.
- Question: Can I represent CAN in the build out of this new Project? They want to get this grant request in by tomorrow. Jonathan has set up a meeting. There are two other neighborhood associations involved - (one downtown + Abernathy)
- Vena: Who is the professor? I'm enthusiastic about the research- but this type of ask has happened a lot in communities in color - and it could be handled well or poorly. I'm hoping they have a good track record. I'd like to know more.
- Gregory: His name is [Johnathan Fink](#), Professor at PSU. Did a good job bringing together different groups, EPA, federal agency, Location age OHA, DEQ, and a couple neighborhood associations and CAAT. I believe he is trying to be as inclusive as possible.
- Vena: Maybe I will come with you.
- Gregory: Meeting is tomorrow between 4-6pm. If not the next meeting. Anyone is welcome to attend.
- Vena: I should be able to attend.
- Gregory: Haven't reached out to other sister organizations yet. If the project goes forward, he will reach out to other sister organizations.
- Chris: Letter said that they are looking at a digital tool, what is this? A communication medium. There is a digital divide that exists and it is an issue. How do you get information across a digital divide via digital tools, eg. cell phones, internet.
- Michael: Seems that the professor will benefit from this - is there a benefit for Cully?
- Gregory: It depends on how we design the project. This is my main concern. It seems there is benefit in this initiative. Whatever happens, we will update the board on what is happened and can always remove our presence in the project.
