Pair of Jacks Farm is offering a 22-week full plate CSA with two membership tiers in the Cully neighborhood. Farmers grow mixed vegetables, fruits, and herbs with organic practices, intention, and creativity. The Pair of Jacks mission is to foster community, network neighbors, and spread joy!

A weekly vegetable share costs \$38; tiers allow you to choose weekly or every-other-week pickups. Pair of Jacks is partnering with Revel Meat (Canby, OR) and Trent Family Farms

- We grow mixed vegetables, fruits, and herbs with organic practices, intention, and creativity. Weekly veggie shares are \$38.
- We are partnering with Revel Meat (Canby, OR) and Trent Family Farms (Cloverdale, OR) to diversify your vegetable selection with pork, beef, and fresh chicken eggs. See website for Add-On options!
- Grow your own veggies at home? You can choose to "add-on" meat or eggs without a veggie share.
- Want veggies every OTHER week? That's an option! Great for smaller households and travelers.
- Pickup will be on-farm, 4609 NE Simpson St., Thursday afternoons from 4-8pm. Season is June 1st -October 26th.
