City leadership shares discussion draft of new organizational structure with employees ahead of city council consideration on Oct. 19

On Sept. 12, Chief Administrative Officer Mike Jordan released his draft recommendation for a new organizational structure that reports up to a city administrator. The reorganization is necessary for a smooth transition to the new form of government that was approved by voters in November 2022.

The City of Portland's City Organization project is creating a new reporting structure that can be managed by one city administrator, as required by the 2022 Charter Amendments. Transitioning away from the commission form of government allows for a whole-city approach to systems and

problem-solving, which is an exciting opportunity for city government to serve all of Portland's communities more efficiently.

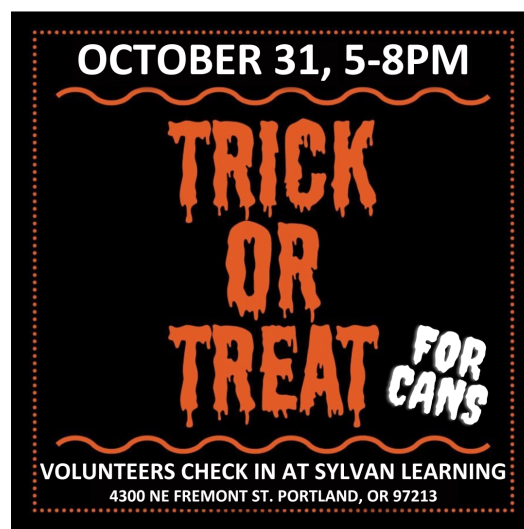

The "Trick or Treat for Cans" event consists of trick or treaters heading door to door on Halloween during Trick or Treating hours, but instead of asking for candy, they will be requesting cans to be donated to Sunshine Division. Volunteers will be given tote bags, since the cans can get heavy fast. Sunshine Division will drop off and pick up barrels at Sylvan Learning Center for the cans to be collected. Volunteers will also receive a map of the neighborhood, so that each person/group covers a few blocks to ensure no one has to walk too much and so everyone goes to different houses.
